Night-O Saturday November 12

A night orienteering event in November has become almost an annual happening for the ROC. This year we will again go to Mendon Ponds Park, which is ideal for night-O with its mix of open fields, roads, and distinct trails. If you've never tried it and can't imagine orienteering at night, come on out and give it a try. There will be all levels of courses, so anyone who can do a White course during the day can also do one at night. The event is based at the East Lodge in Mendon, and there will be a mass start at 5:30 p.m.

Ski Orienteering

Orienteering doesn't have to stop when the snow falls. New York State is the hottest part of the country for the cool sport of Ski Orienteering (Ski-O) because it is part of the annual Empire State Games in Lake Placid. People qualify by successfully completing two local ski-o meets. ROC has two scheduled at Oatka Creek, Saturday, January 7 and Mendon Ponds, Sunday, January 22. Participation in the Lake Placid Games is free!

The orienteering is somewhat different: all controls are on trails, though an occasional bushwhack may be

advantageous. This may sound like a white course, but route choice is often called for, and sometimes complicated trail systems can be confusing. The map has to be attached to something, since both hands are holding ski poles. More information is available at <http://emp.us.orienteering.org/ski-o/>. Courses

The club uses the USOF "color" designations wherever applicable. A description of the courses is as follows:

The White course is intended to be easy enough for first-time participants after a short introduction to the sport. Control points are generally on trails or similarly easy-to-locate features.

The Yellow course is slightly more difficult than the White course. Control points are generally placed close to but not right at easy-to-find features, such as on a knoll that is 50 m away from a trail junction.

The Orange course requires more map-reading and course-planning skills than the Yellow course. Controls will generally have a good attack point, but the attack point may be more subtle than on the Yellow course, or the control will be placed further from the attack point. The route choice from one control to the attack point for the next control is often less obvious than on the Yellow course.

The Brown, Green, Red, and Blue courses differ from each other only in length. At local parks, they are usually the most difficult course that can be set given the size and the terrain of the park. Map-reading, compass, and route-planning skills will be tested to a greater degree on this course.

Sometimes other courses may be offered, such as a Motala (a course which involves one or more map exchanges), or a Line-O or Score-O. These courses will be explained in the meet instructions at any meet that uses these formats.

The entry fees to ROC meets are \$3.00 per individual or group for ROC members and \$6.00 for non-members. If several people (a family group for example) enter as a group using the same map, the fee is still \$3.00 (members) or \$6.00 (non-members). Additional maps are available for \$1.00 each. A person or group can do a second course using the same map for no additional charge (if you complete the White course and decide to try the Yellow course, for example).

Beginner instruction

Beginners are always welcome; there is an informal beginners' clinic approximately 15 minutes after the beginning of the event, and all meets offer a course suitable for beginning orienteers.

New and Improved Mendon Ponds Permanent Course by Tom Cornell

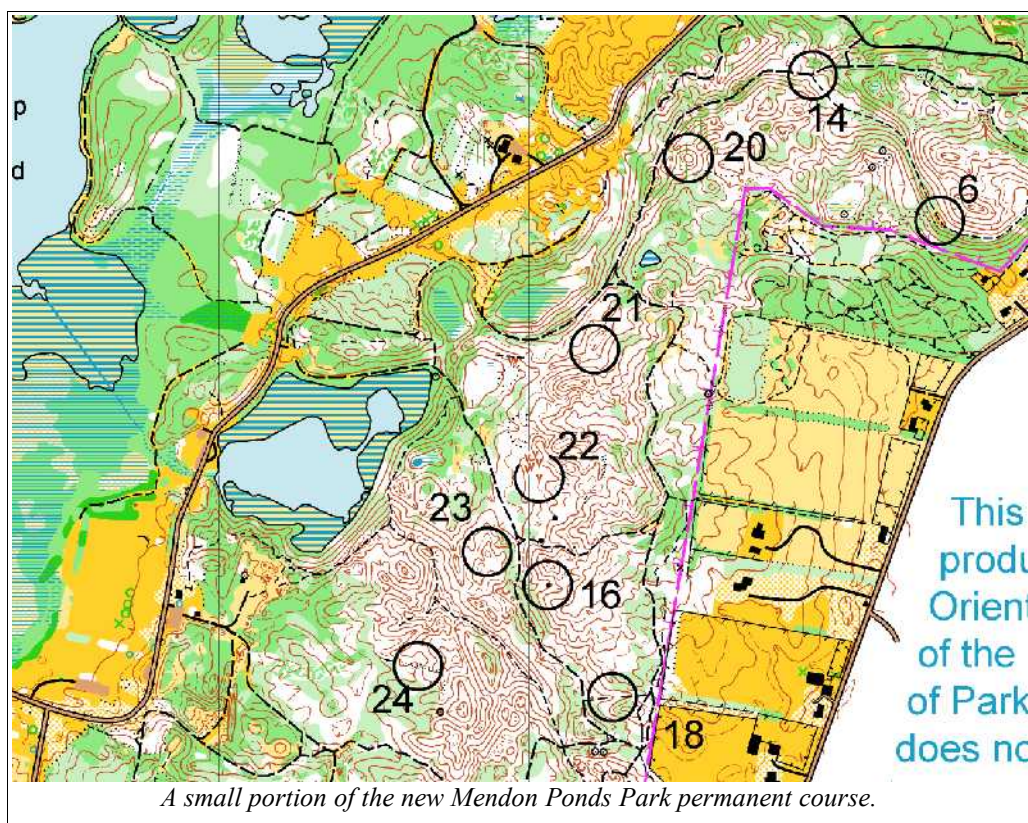
The revised Mendon Ponds Permanent Orienteering Course is finally in place and map-kits should be available by the time of this printing. The course is printed on the new 1:15,000 map and utilizes areas “off trail” formerly not permitted in this park. Consequently, the course has many more interesting and technically challenging controls and features. The controls on

the old course will also remain in place for a few years.

Our thanks to Park Supervisor Eileen Kennedy for granting us permission to use these new areas of the park. My personal thanks also to Jim Lavine, Doug Brooks, Joe Shonk, Dayle and Rick Lavine, Rick Worner, Dick Detwiler, Eric Barbehenn, and especially Sandra Lomker who spent many hours and a lot of energy helping me carry the almost sixty pounds of equipment needed to install or move the posts.

Permanent courses have fixed control-posts that remain in place year-round. They are identified on the clue sheet as Easy, Medium or Difficult to enable beginners to start out at a comfortable level. These courses are a great way to learn (or teach) the basic concepts of orienteering and also explore areas in the park normally not seen. Children have a lot of fun being the first to see the control, while adults find this leisurely approach a good way to develop their skills. The course may be completed in several trips to the park as there is no time limit or designated order. The map-kits contain a full-color map with marked control locations, a sheet of helpful information, clues, and a punchcard for recording the control code-letter as they are found. The card, when completed, can be mailed to the club for a certificate and coupon that can be used for a club event or towards a club membership. Map-kits are available at all of our events, The Map Shop, ADK meetings and several outdoor stores.

Besides Mendon Ponds, the club currently maintains permanent courses in Durand Eastman and Webster County Parks and in Letchworth State Park.

Rattlesnake Hill Rogaine Report – September 10, 2005

We had a very successful first-ever event using the new Rattlesnake map. The weather was great, and people seemed to really like the map and the courses that were set. Around 60 people turned out to enjoy the courses.. Based on the great weather and the nice publicity from Gary Falleson, we were hoping to get a few more day of the meet entrants.

The winner of the 12-hour category was a team from Detroit, named The Over the Hill Gang (Paul Piorkowski and Richard Waldo). They got every control except for one (#60), and they were only about 10 minutes away from that one with more than an hour and a half left, but made the very wise decision that if they were going to be in on time, they had to forego that one. As it was, they came in around 5 minutes before the deadline. For those of you who did any of the time categories in this rogaine, I'm sure you can appreciate what an achievement it was to bag 49 out of the 50 controls. The course setters really didn't think that anyone would come that close to getting them all.

In addition to being very good rogainers, this team was also very gracious. They were very complimentary about the terrain, the map, and the course. They even remarked how they had competed in the rogaine world championships a few years ago, and they thought our meet was much better than that meet! They thanked all of the volunteers profusely for our work.

Also, we had an interesting situation with one control (#39). It appears to have been stolen by a bear. We're not making this up! Someone found it a ways from where it was supposed to be, with significant damage to it, and claw marks on the board

for the intention sheet. This nice person put it back in its proper location, so most of the people who tried for it did find it. We know that Karl looked for it and it was NOT there though! We're going to credit him with finding this control. Anyone else who can vouch that they did look for it and that it was not present, please let me know and we'll credit you as well.

Thanks to everyone who helped out with this meet, it was a lot of work and it would have been impossible without so many people pitching in significantly. 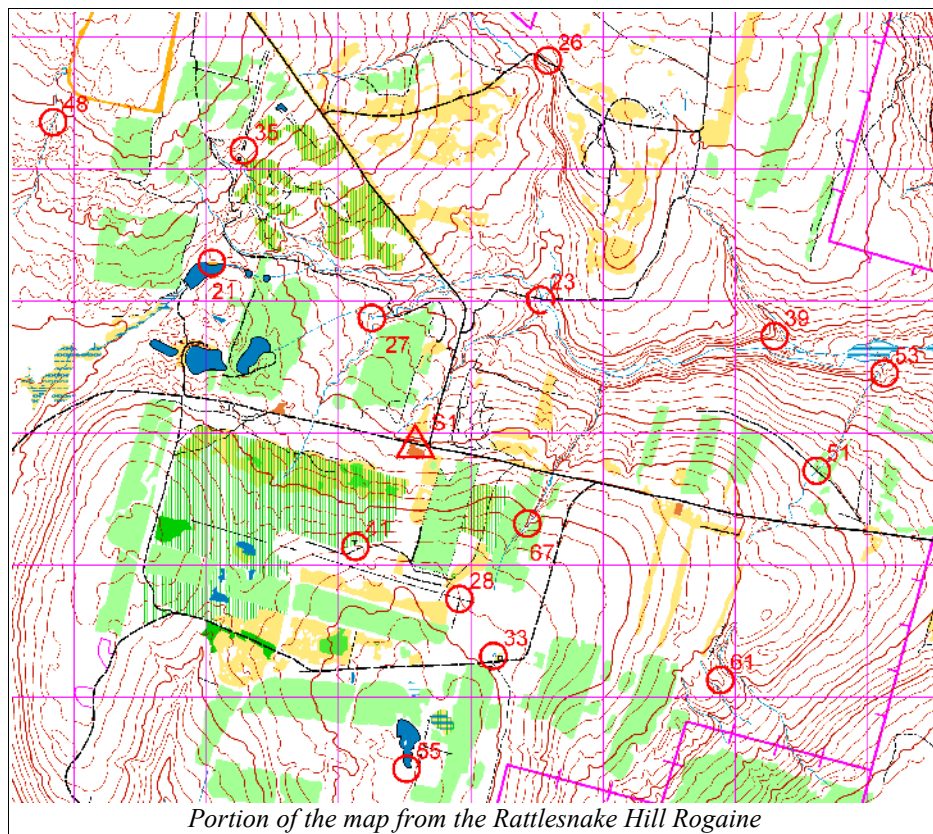
